

DIRECTOR'S BOOK NOOK

Many patrons often ask, "How do you come up with ideas for your wonderful programs?" I tell them it's because we have a talented & creative staff that often brainstorms program ideas together at our staff meetings. We also come up with ideas for new programs, services, & technological innovations by attending conferences where we can receive continuing education credits & training. These conferences provide all of West Virginia's librarians an opportunity to brainstorm together & share ideas so we can provide greater library services to West Virginia patrons statewide.

This month our staff will all attend the West Virginia Library Association Spring Fling Conference in Morgantown, WV. During the conference, we'll be able to share some program ideas with our colleagues by leading two of the workshops. I'll be doing a presentation titled "Reading to Adults: Storytime Is Not Just for Children Anymore." This presentation will be about how the library has started doing poetry & short story readings for adults from classic & contemporary literature during cultural holiday programs such as Halloween & Christmas. In Carla Long's presentation on "The Pros & Cons of Cons," she'll explain to our colleagues how they can host a Comic -Con style program at their libraries based on her experience of putting together the MiniCon program here at the Jackson County Public Library in Ripley over the past five years.

Also, April is National Poetry Month. Starting at 12 noon on Saturday, April 6th, at the Ripley Library, Poet Judd Kirk will be doing poetry readings, after which local storyteller Susanna "Granny Sue" Holstein will conduct a poetry workshop. And all throughout the month of April, the Ravenswood Library will be sponsoring a "Poet Tree" that patrons can contribute to.

And speaking of MiniCon, since it's now April, it's time for MiniCon 2019. The theme of this year's MiniCon is "Here There Be Dragons." MiniCon will be on Saturday, April 13th, from 3:00 to 8:00 pm at the Ripley Library. Please look through the rest of the newsletter for further details about this & all of our other programs.
